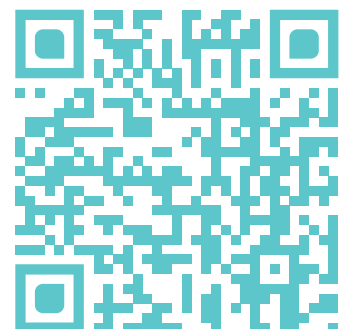

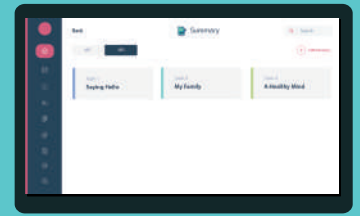

Academic English Course (15 hours)

Aims

The principle aims of the course are:

- To help you learn English through English.
- To provide a chance to build on and develop a level of Academic English among students through relevant skills and topics.
- To provide encouragement and support to apply your Academic English skills in your current or future studies.
- To tackle common difficulties in Academic contexts and address weaknesses.

Learning Outcomes

During this course you will:

- Become more familiar with academic language skills.
- Develop and use academic vocabulary.
- Give opinions in speaking and writing tasks.
- Understand the importance of register, style and format in writing (e.g. essays).
- Listen to longer texts (e.g. lectures).
- Learn how to evaluate your work and that of others.

After this course you will:

- Be more confident to communicate in academic contexts.
- Understand the expectations of academic English.
- Think more critically about a range of subjects.
- Be able to write academic texts including paragraphs and essays.
- Be more reflective and able to work independently.

Content

Topics are related closely to those in the General English Series but the skills and language that can be adapted to an academic context have been selected as the focus. The tasks are aimed to provide additional practice while introducing academic skills necessary for future studies.

Topics for Elementary Level 1 include:

- Descriptive language
- Expressing opinions
- Formal writing and speaking
- Presentations
- Note-making
- Error correction ... and many more
- Word formation

Assessment

There is no final examination at the end of the course. Assessment is the student's "Portfolio Record".

Entry Requirement

A minimum level of English equivalent to CEFR A1 to get the most from this course.

The minimum age limit to join the course is 12.
